

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

from the Pastor...

Below is a picture that I took of the area of the Judean Wilderness near where the Dead Sea scrolls were found. I include it because it is a rather profound wilderness. I doubt very much that is has changed since the time of Jesus, and

even long before that. Our trip to the Holy Land was a deep blessing for Bob and me. The richness of being on location in the Holy Land was so moving, spiritually. To see the Sea of Galilee seemed important—for we know that Sea itself has not changed—so, it was somewhat breathtaking to imagine Jesus walking on the water there, or to imagine the disciples in a boat in a storm, or even simply fishing.

But the Wilderness too, was also stark and powerfully spiritual location. It too stands unchanged by thousands of years of Christian devotion and pilgrimage. Standing in the desert, with the warm breeze blowing and no other sound, one



can hear what Jesus heard, and saw and then one can imagine the

difficulty of those 40 days he spent in the wilderness, being tempted. The views, the loneliness and isolation are stark and pure. As we enter our 40 day period of Lent, we hearken back to these 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness. His journey in the wilderness can really also be seen as our own story. No, we aren't in the Judean wilderness, and we might not actually hear the devil's voice in our ear. But in a true sense, it IS our story. Every day. The human story. Every day we are blasted by temptations and choices that those temptations bring.

Will I pass along that bit of gossip about someone? It's so juicy, it is hard to pass up. Will I treat my co-workers or family fairly? Will I speak the truth unkindly, or will I speak the truth gently in love? Will my stress and anxiety be expressed by anger and frustration to those I care for?

Jesus left the desert after having been tempted and making all of the right choices. We often make the wrong choices—at least I know that I do. At each wrong choice, we turn away from God and the love and thriving God wants for all of us. It is at this point that we must realize that we are all a project that is 'under construction' and Lent is the season where we repent, which really means to turn around, to 're-turn' to God and God's will for us. We ask for and receive forgiveness—like water in the desert, which our Lord longs to supply to us.

As the son in the parable of the Prodigal Son returns to his father for forgiveness and another chance—so does our Lord long for us to return and receive his mercy and love. He waits for us, not to judge us, but to embrace us and welcome us home. May you remember this as you go out into the wilderness of the world each day and may you remember who awaits you to embrace you and forgive you. Return to him and be reminded of whose you are. Receive that water of forgiveness in the wilderness.

Feast and Fast

During the season of Lent, we hear about the discipline of fasting. We may be inclined to 'give up' or fast from something as an expression of a sacrifice. Food items are common targets, as are bad habits. We tend to 'give up' something we should not be engaging in in the first place. Perhaps we think that because it is a religious discipline, God will help give us the will power that we lack on our own. Whatever the motivation, when we fast from something there is always a response of feasting. When we give up cookies for example, chips often take their place. The feasting response is often as harmful to us as what we are fasting from. An alternative to feasting on similar targets is to feast on something that honors God and the sacrifices that Jesus has made for us. Feast on reading the Word. Feast on prayer in new times, ways and locations. Feast on midweek worship and meals. You just may establish a new positive habit at the end of the Lenten season.


OFFERING COUNTERS & USHERS
