from the Pastor ...



Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say, rejoice! Philippians 4:4

I remember about 5 or so years ago, when vacation time rolled around, and we were

concerned about remembering to 'take Jesus with us' on vacation! So, we did a little project where we passed out cutouts of '*Flat Jesus*' you could color or decorate. He got glued to a tongue depressor and off you went! You could take selfies of yourself and *Flat Jesus* wherever you went and send them into us at church. Now, I think we still have a few of those *Flat Jesus's* around here somewhere-but the thing that is different and has really changed over the years is that NOW, you can take your church with you on vacation!

We worried about folks becoming disconnected from the church and community over long vacation periods back then. And still I would urge you to take your faith along with you wherever you are headed this summer—a few suggestions later in this newsletter! But what has really changed over these last three years because of the pandemic is that you can take *us* with you wherever you go this summer! No—you don't have the expense or annoyance of bringing us **all** with you—no reservations or extra tents are needed!

But if you have an internet connection, wherever you are in the world, you can tune into the St. Mark's Facebook page or our website (www.stmarksvalleyne.com) and you will be with us! It's one of those crazy but good-unintended consequences of enduring the pandemic. We were forced into livestreaming if we wanted to stay connected to our people and vice versa! Who knew such good would come out of such a scary and difficult experience? And yet...it did!

Since we have been re-gathered as the church in person—postpandemic, I have noticed a few differences or changes. Perhaps it is too soon to say whether they are good or not—but I think they are ultimately good—because we've learned a few things. This list is not final or exhaustive, but I think we learned for sure **never to take for granted the enormous blessing of being able to worship together in person**!

I don't know if it is just because I am a Pastor but, I physically ached at not being able to see people! Ached, not to be able to greet one another with a smile or a hug! It felt so hard not to see expressions or smiles. For me, a hugger- it felt like punishment **not** to hug people. It made me realize how important that time of greeting after the service is—to actually *see* how folks are doing. I don't miss wearing a mask. I don't miss social distancing. I don't miss worrying about keeping people safe from my 'vapor cloud' or causing someone to be sick. I don't miss those things. I don't miss those days. But ultimately, the pandemic brought good in some unexpected ways.

I am so happy to hear voices singing in church again! How wonderful to have the choir again, the bells and kids up front for the Children's sermon! How beautiful to see all the faces gathered, to hear voices together reciting the Creeds and the prayers! These things were **all missing** in the depths of the pandemic! But even more, for me, it is holy and wonderful to be able to give communion again as we gather at the altar railing and not the parking lot-though we were happy even for that, at the time! Such losses we endured! Things we NEVER expected to lose—hugs for the grieving, communion, seeing each other's faces, community meals, family celebrations, worship! **Together!!** It seems as if it took a pandemic, filled with losses to teach us *how very blessed* we are! And...I think that we have gotten the message the pandemic taught us. **Gratitude.** Gratitude for worship and all it contains and offers. Gratitude for our church family! Each individual member, and child- a precious gift from God! Gratitude for life, and life as we live it out as a faith community. Worshipping our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer together. Gratitude for the solace, support and the joy this community imparts!

I do admit that we might be a bit more loudly joyous about being in one another's company than ever before. We were always friendly-we are more so. We were always faithful, but I feel there's been an upswelling of faith here! St. Mark's is <u>still</u> <u>here</u> after this pandemic because you all decided that you wanted and needed your church to be here! It was the faithfulness of this community that kept the church from closing its doors forever. Some churches didn't make it through the changes and difficulties that the pandemic presented. I thank God for your faithfulness, and it is with joy that I witness the somewhat raucous passing of the peace lately. But, I believe that I know what is behind it—gratefulness to God!

- Shampoo/conditioners (hotel samples are great)
- Small stuffed animals new or slightly used
- Tote bag or grocery-type recycle bags
- Old cell phones (used for 911 only)
- Comb/bush
- Body wash/body lotions
- diapers
- Gently used suit cases

Please begin collecting these items at your home and we will let you know where to bring the items. The collections dates are from May 5 to June 30.
