And here we go again, into our new season of school, activities, and even worship! Our short service for summer-with the shortened liturgy and not as many scripture readings will now return to a full-bodied service. Kids are settling back into the

school routines, as are parents. I read an article that said that Americans traveled 'with a vengeance' this summer. It was a way, it seems, of trying to erase all the restrictions we endured, all the things we felt we missed out on, through the years of the Covid pandemic. I get that. We are <u>so</u> very anxious to get back to life as it was, aren't we? We've been tired of the changes and rules.

Of course, we know that the virus has not completely gone, but we have certainly learned of ways to cope with it now. Some of the changes we made are mostly over—such as wearing a mask, but other changes have become a permanent way of us doing worship. For instance, we have become a congregation that will always livestream our worship now, and that's a good thing! Many have wound up benefiting from what was an early necessity-to where our services are always online. You can tune in and watch a service live, or...you can tune in at midnight some day if that's when you have time...either way-we reach out to our homebound, vacationing, and sick people in this way. In this one way-more than any other-we were *forced* to change, and it was a good thing! It is the 'lemonade' that we made with the 'lemon' that was the pandemic.

I say all that, to say this—in *all* seasons, no matter what is happening, we must learn this lesson over and over-to rejoice and be glad—for God is in control. We hear this in Philippians-"Rejoice in the Lord, again I say, rejoice," Philippians 4:4.

We seemed to have had a black little cloud following us around most of the summer, from a hit and run accident to our car in a parking lot, to surgery on my neck, to my accident with Luke resulting in very painful burns and torn ligaments, to Bob's broken rib—it hasn't been a fun summer or one for taking any kind of 'vengeance vacation'! It's been difficult—but you all sent us so many cards, and gifts of food, gift cards, flowers, edible flower arrangements, special soups, desserts—just too many to list! It was overwhelming how good you all were to us! Thank you, thank you, thank you! You kept us ever in prayer and it helped! We are SO grateful to God for all of you and all that you did for us during a difficult summer. Some even showed up to cut the grass for Bob after he broke his rib! WE JUST CANNOT SAY THANK YOU ENOUGH!

Initially I tried-I got some thank you's written and sent out, but after the ankle debacle and the attendant pain—those stopped, and my list got lost. I apologize for those missing thank you's. Please know how very grateful we are for the prayer's, the love, and the encouragement—in all the ways you made that real to us. You showed Christ's love to us in myriads of ways.

And so, through all of you, the 'lemons' of accidents, surgery, painful mishaps, and broken bones, got turned into the 'lemonade' of prayer, care, food and acts of service. I thank you all and we thank God for the love God showed to us through you.

I have said before but will say again—thank you to Karen King for her wonderful work in leading the Sunday Services and preaching that she so ably did for me. She too, is a gift of God and we are blessed to have her here at St. Mark's. Thanks to Jan for holding down the fort as well!! What wonderful coworkers!!

We have so much to be grateful for in our God and through the love and fellowship of God's people that is manifest here among us. I think it's time for some lemonade! Where has God done that in your life?

Feelings are hurt. The seamstresses, leadership and congregation are sad that a gift from the church is not cherished as much as they cherish the youth. I imagine that is exactly how God feels when his gift that is designed, created and offered to us is not claimed. God continually offers his love to us in a variety of ways and yet we fail to accept it as the treasure it is. God does not "track us down" and force his gifts upon us. He created humans with the option of choice. It is up to us to choose to claim his love as the treasure it truly is.

PERSONAL CARE KITS for LWR Ingathering of items: August 22 thru Oct. 10

The following items are included in each Personal Care Kit:

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging

ONE sturdy wide tooth comb, remove packaging

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Be sure to shop for light-or medium-weight towels, which are easier for kit recipients to hand wash and air dry.
 Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages. Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
