


## TRAITS OF HEALTHY FAMILIES: Dolores Curran

Lord, teach us to pray...Luke 11:1

I was surprised last week when I asked our Confirmands what they wanted to learn especially this year and 3 out of 4 responded that they wanted to learn to pray, or they wanted to learn more about praying, even specific prayers. I am so glad to see this from our Confirmands-there is really **nothing** that is more important than pursuing a closer relationship with our Lord in prayer!

There is no perfect or correct way to pray—there are many different ways, many different prayers and many who would teach us. But, to me, the best way to pray is the way that is **most natural to you**. In the movie *Fiddler on the Roof*, Tevye, a dairyman and the father and main character generally keeps up a running conversation with God all day long, while he delivers milk. He asks why he isn't rich; he talks to God about what that would be like. He talks about his wife, his daughters, his troubles, his joys, and his dreams.

I think God would be very pleased with prayers like that—why? Because that means we see our God as our friend, our God yes, but also one who is with us, is on our side, and **wants to hear from us** is **always** listening. I'm afraid that we don't pray because we are intimidated by speaking to God. We put on a more proper persona even a formal language we don't normally use. I think that God would rather have more time with us—our hearts outpoured, rather than fancy, stilted language. **He knows us!** He loves us and he knows how we talk! We should just talk to him more! So, if one wants to learn to pray—simply do it...more!! Talk to God...about everyday things—more! Bring God into your everyday life! That, I think, is the lesson on prayer from Tevye

When his disciples asked him to teach them to pray—Jesus never said—"Ok, hang on, I'll make flyers, we'll get people and hold a seminar! Instead, Jesus began by just praying. The Lord's Prayer is a very good prayer. We can study it and dissect it and learn a lot. But I really do think the Lord would simply have us pray—make time, and then talk to him—about everything!

Do you have a place where you like to pray? If you do not, what if you made a nice little inviting nook for yourself? Or perhaps you might try praying while you are walking. Changing one's location can help to keep things from getting stale and rote. You might pray for your neighbors, your neighborhood, or your city as you walk—or, you can be like Tevye and simply talk to God while walking, as if Jesus is walking with you-because...he is!

Another thing you might try is to engage your imagination while you are praying to change it up sometimes. Imagine as clearly as you can, a favorite spot outdoors. Perhaps it is under a favorite tree, or sitting on a beach in a favorite spot, or maybe it is on your grandparent's old tire swing...whatever place you are imagining in your mind, invite the Lord to be there with you. I don't do this all the time, but I find it comforting when I do, to imagine the Lord there with me in a special place. Perhaps you may find it so as well. *Whatever* encourages you to pray, try.

But, really the very most important thing is **to pray**-to truly pray-as often as needed. Pray like Tevye—talk about your day—about all your concerns, your questions...all of it! God, as our parent, loves to hear from us as much **or more** than we love hearing from our children. Pray, and expect to be heard, and loved. Your servant in Christ,
